



Rules of the Road



Avoiding Propeller Strikes

Sometime ago, more specifically back in the early 1970s when I was slightly more interested in muscle cars than boating, an acquaintance lost his life in a boating accident. The accident, as I remember it, was one in which the guy was hit in the head by the propeller from another boat after he had fallen into the water while water skiing. Believe me when I say I was shaken a bit as I had just been water skiing with my girlfriend and her family.

Of course I wondered how the accident had happened since my water skiing experience was fun and filled with safety precautions. My girlfriend's father was always at the wheel and her mother was lookout. The teenagers and I took turns tending to the tow line and helping get skiers in and out of the water. At the end of the day I thought I could not get enough water skiing until I heard the news about the accident.

I do not recall ever going water skiing again. The accident did not stop me from boating activities and has always reminded me how quickly accidents can occur.

On April 7^{th,} three of my CG Auxiliary friends were on a safety patrol passing through the beach area at Stump Pass heading north into ski alley. As the guys tell it there were many boats pulled up and onto the beach at anchor. Due to the strong tidal current, the boats were tightly stacked parallel to each other. And of course there were swimmers and beach goers everywhere.

As the Auxiliary boat and crew were passing by, one of the beached boats started backing off the beach. At that very moment a swimmer appeared behind the boat that was backing out from the beach. The swimmer could not get out of the way due to the strong current. A lot of screaming and waving of arms helped prevent a potentially nasty accident.

From the Auxiliary Department of Recreational Outreach and <u>Seaworthy</u> magazine April 2012 issue, (the Boat/US Marine Insurance & Damage Avoidance Report) here are a few tips to help avoid propeller strikes:

- Keep your feet in the boat, never allow passengers to ride on the bow, gunwales or transom.
- Never put your engine into gear until you can visually confirm everyone who was in the water is safely inside the boat.
- Be aware of wakes, slow down when you see large wakes coming and cross those wakes at an angle.
- Booze and Lose, alcohol plays a key role in many propeller injuries. So leave the booze at home or drink in moderation or use a designated driver.
- Keep a sharp lookout. Many skiers, swimmers and divers have been killed or seriously injured by propellers. Retrieve skiers quickly, stay well away from swimming zones and never back toward a person in the water
- Stay off swim platforms when underway! Keep everyone away from slippery swim platforms
 while the engine is in gear. Do not use an outboard's lower unit as a boarding ladder. Even
 when propellers are not moving, they are sharp enough to cause serious injury.
